



As the situation pertaining to the COVID-19 continues to develop, the Town of Oakville has decided it is in the best interest of all members of the community to temporarily close **all recreation facilities and public libraries.**

The facility closure will begin on **Friday, March 13, 2020 at 4:00pm, and is expected to last until Sunday, April 5, 2020 or Monday, April 6, 2020.**

Updates will be provided as more information becomes available from the Town of Oakville.

The Sixteen Mile Sports Complex and Glen Abbey Recreation Centre are public recreation facilities operated by the Town of Oakville, therefore these facilities will be closed, and any programming or events, including daytime shinny ice, Skate Oakville has scheduled at either location are cancelled until the facilities resume operations.

Therefore, all programming scheduled between Friday, March 13, 2020 at 3:00pm and the end of the facility closure is cancelled. Credits will be issued for cancelled programming to your online account.

All Daytime Shinny Ice at the Sixteen Mile Sports Complex is cancelled until further notice.

When we receive information regarding the re-opening date of facilities, you will be notified via the email we have on your account. We encourage you to follow our social media channels @SkateOakville on Instagram & Twitter and facebook.com/SkateOakville and SkateOakville.ca for updates.

The Skate Oakville office will be closed as of **Friday, March 13, 2020 at 4:00pm**, and we will continue to monitor our emails during the closure. Registrations are available at any time online at register.skateoakville.ca . Withdrawals from programs are only accepted via email to office@skateoakville.ca and are handled in the order they are received.
